**Full Text Notification Reminds You that the Deadline for Submission is 15 June 2019, We wish you success in your work.**

**The language of publication is Turkish and English.**

All manuscripts should be written in Microsoft Word software program in Times New Roman 12 pt. Except for the first page, each page must be numbered at the top right. Manuscripts should not exceed 10 pages including figures, tables and tables.

The paper should include **title, author/author names, addresses, abstract and keywords, introduction, material and method, findings, discussion and conclusion, acknowledgements and references respectively.**

Headings, abstracts, keywords and title of tables and figures should be written in both languages. In the studies of the corresponding writers whose native language is not Turkish, Turkish summary is not required. Acknowledgments should be limited to declare the technical support only.

**The topic** should be short, clear and should be written in bold. The explanations of the study should be indicated with a footnote sign.

**The author(s)**, names and surnames must be specified in bold; surnames should be written in capital letters.

**The abstract** should be a maximum of **250** words in a single paragraph.

**Keywords** should be written in alphabetical order and should not be more than 5 words.

**In the introduction**, after giving the short literature directly related to the study, the hypothesis and purpose of the study should be written in the last paragraph. This section should not exceed 2 pages.

**The Material and Method** should be written in a clear and concise way, without any unnecessary detail. The type of the research (Descriptive, Observation, Experimental, Case-Control, etc.), the characteristics of the subjects, the data collection phase of the subjects with the inclusion or not to be taken into consideration, the sampling method if used, and the representation ability of the sample is provided, the reasons why the sample has been used should be written. The sample size, the measurement methods, and the follow-up studies if used, the rates of censored and lost observations and their causes should be indicated. Statistical analysis, the reasons for use and the statistical procedures should be included.

**In the Findings section**, the data should be briefly explained. Repetition of the findings given in the tables should be avoided.

In the Materials and Method and Findings sections, the sub-headings should be in italics and the second sub-headings should be specified in the normal font. The italic subheading should be placed at the beginning of the paragraph. Pictures must be at least 1920 x 1280 dpi resolutions. Tables and figures should be given on separate pages at the end of the publication.

**Abbreviations**, symbols and measures: Abbreviations should be written in the brackets where the related word first used in the text; for example, Canine Transmissible Veneral Tumor (CTVT). Latin genus and species names should be written in italic font. All dimensions must be given according to the Systeme Internationale (SI).

**In the Discussion and Conclusion section**, the data should be discussed and interpreted in the light of the literature.

**The list of references** should be given in alphabetical order. In the source writing, the names of the authors are bold, the year of publication is normal in brackets, the banner is italic, with the short name of the journal the page numbers are normal and the journal.

The number of sections should be written in bold typeface. In the case of multi-authored studies, the names of up to 3 authors should be separated by commas. References in the text should be written with the surname and date of the author (eg: Morgan, 2012). If there is more than one reference in the text that uses the same subject, their dates should be sorted from the old to new.

**If the source is on the internet**, it must be written with the date of access.

Li G., Hart A, Gregory J (1998): The effect of velocity gradient on flocculation. <http://www.serv.com/projects/paper2.html>. (20 May 2004).

**Correspondence address** should be included at the end of the study. In multi-authored studies, only one of the authors should be named as the correspondence address.

In scientific studies based on animal experiments, the term Ethics Committee Approval Has Been Taken On must be included in the material method section of the study.

The responsibility of all published articles belongs to the authors.
